

Brian's Story of Success

During the Fall of 2021, Brian began his employment at McCaffrey's in New Hope, PA. Brian was hired to complete the maintenance tasks at this local and family-owned grocery store. Over the past year, Brian has strengthened his work skills, became friends with multiple coworkers, and has developed a true connection with his employment.

Brian starts his day by getting to work early so he has time to sit at the front counter and enjoy a coffee from the store cafe. Over the summer, Brian was assigned some new job tasks in the Deli Department. Brian is now crossed trained in packing prepared foods, using the cheese slicer, weighing packaged foods, and assisting in the Gourmet Cheese Department. In this department, Brian works side by side with Dennis. Brian assists with packaging cheese, wrapping cheese in plastic, labeling the cheese, weighing it, and stocking the shelves. Dennis said that Brian knows how to do a lot of the different jobs in the store. He really likes working with Brian. Dennis says "Brian makes it fun here at Mccaffrey's. He has a great sense of humor and keeps things interesting. It's good for customers to see that the employees are having fun in the positive environment of the store". Brian has developed a meaningful rapport with Dennis which is evident by the amount of work they accomplish when working together.

Brian's coworkers have explained that he is "Very sweet, he'll do anything I ask him to do". "Brian is a hard worker. He is a passionate, very friendly, a good guy, takes his work seriously but can have fun. He gets along with everybody and everyone adores him. He has improved since he first started. Now he is doing deli, cheese prepared food, carts, maintenance. When they page him, he is available!". Lastly, one of Brian's biggest fans, Nicole, says "Brian has a good heart, he cares more about than what's in his job description."

When you ask Brian how this job makes him feel, he will tell you: "This keeps me occupied; it's makes a good day when I see the store manager because he works hard and makes me want to work hard too." In Brian's spare time he helps with the local football team, plays video games such as wrestling and football, goes to wrestling events with his brother, and helps at his local fire company during special events.



A Message from the Executive Director Mary Sautter, MSOL

I hope this newsletter finds you and your family healthy and well. BARC Developmental Services is celebrating 71 years of supports and service to children and adults with intellectual disabilities and autism. I am happy to share that we had an increase over the past 6 months in community engagement and in-person events, a hopeful sign of adapting to a new "normal" post-pandemic.

The agency had a positive bottom line in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022. As we head into 2023, the same challenges continue: advocating for greater funding on the federal and state levels; the staffing crisis; greater scrutiny by regulatory oversight; and potential service model changes, particularly in the vocational department. The fiscal challenges are not new, and we have been

successful in obtaining extra funding via COVID-related grants from the state and county levels over the past couple of years.

BARC Developmental Services continues to offer supports to children and adults in three service departments – Early Intervention, Residential, and Vocational. Our Early Intervention Department offers therapies for over 400 children living in Bucks County aged birth to 3 years old in their natural environments. As you will read in this newsletter, we recently vacated the building in Croydon that housed classrooms for children 3–5 years old for several decades-a bittersweet end to an era. The two vocational workshop facilities continue to operate on a limited basis and the department celebrated the reopening of the Adult Training Facilities program in Quakertown. Also, the Joint Opportunities for Business and Society (JOBS) program actively supports nine individuals in their community jobs. Our Residential Department provides every form of living options in Bucks and Montgomery County. The maintenance team has renovated two homes that were purchased in early 2022; one of them opened in August that supports three women and the other home is scheduled to open in December.

The agency's Development Committee oversees and monitors all fundraising activities. We were able to hold two in-person events recently: Designer Handbag Bingo and the annual Autumn Luncheon. This was the 41st year of having the luncheon and it was a great success! We are grateful for all our sponsors, participants and volunteers and thank them for their generosity.

Our grant program assists both program and renovation/maintenance needs for our facilities. In 2022, we secured grant funding for several projects, including a ramp at a residential home, a ramp at a vocational facility, and repaving of the parking lot at the Quakertown Vocational facility.

We continue to be proud of the quality of supports we provide to children and adults with intellectual disabilities and autism. Thank you to all our stakeholders and constituents for your support, it is very much appreciated. I wish you all a happy and healthy holiday season.

Justin T. Schram Award

Justin was an avid musician, bandleader, psycho-therapist, and certified K-6 teacher in New Jersey and Colorado. Justin was dedicated to helping others. The Justin T. The Length of Service Ceremony held on October 7th at Peace Valley Park honored BARC associates for their years of dedication to the agency. Executive Director, Mary Sautter and VP of Trinity Assest Protection, Catherine McLain, presented the 2022 Justin T. Schram Award to **Catherine Stumpf**, ATF/ Seniors Manager and **Shnica Smith**, Assistant Production Manager.

According to her nominators, Catherine Stumpf should be selected as the recipient of the Justin T Schram award because if you were to walk through the BPSQ ATF, you'll always see her out on the floor going above and beyond for our folks and her staff. If you talk to anyone who knows Cat, they will tell you that she is the kind of person that will give you the shirt off her back. She's always a shoulder you can cry on for staff and the individuals. When an individual is upset, Cat is the first one to step up and take action to see what's wrong and how it can be fixed. During COVID, Cat worked many hours at our homes. She was working in three different houses during this time, making homemade dinners and taking the ladies on community outings. She knows all the ADLs and all the ISP and behavior support plans for the folks she supports in the ATF and the residential homes she works in.

Cat is someone that everyone admires. She is truly one of the hardest workers. With how much she worked through COVID and how much dedication she has for this agency, Cat showed exceptional work ethic. If this award is for the person who goes above and beyond, then the person most deserving is Catherine Stumpf.


Our agency began providing services to both children & adults having special needs at the Croydon location in 1968. A group of concerned parents advocated to obtain supports for their children. Joan Esling, a lifelong resident of Croydon, led the parents in working with township officials to identify a location where the children & adults would have opportunities to grow and learn. Joan continued to be involved and on the board of the agency for many years.

The Vocational Program operated on one side of the building while the Early Intervention Program was on the other. As the programs expanded, Vocational relocated to two facilities now in Quakertown and Warminster. The site in Croydon was renovated to better meet the needs of the children.

Over the years, Early Intervention expanded and partnered with the Bucks County Intermediate Unit & Bucks County Head Start to support the community. Over 50 years at the site we supported approximately 10,000 Infants, Toddlers and Preschool children. The building provided a safe space for the families to network, socialize and participate in trainings while the children received therapies and time to play.







Special Thanks to Georgeanne Hopkins who wore many hats at the location over the years, too many to mention. Georgeanne was instrumental in preparing the site for us to leave and all the steps necessary to relocate to the new space in Langhorne.

With \$13,500 raised, the agency maintenance team was able to coordinate the construction of the sidewalks quickly and efficiently making the building a safer place for the adults supported within this vocational program. All donors will be invited to a dedication ceremony being planned for the Spring.

This year, we'd like to focus on our Residential Program so we can continue to provide safe and sustainable homes to our supported individuals throughout their lifespan. Some of our homes are in need of a ramp and walkway egress to ensure proper evacuation for individuals with mobility challenges in the event of an emergency.




Gift Card Raffle

Director. Thanks to everyone who participated!


