Capstone Project

Since January, Madalyn Pacheco has been interning at BARC Production Services in Warminster (BPSW) completing a Capstone project as part of her requirement to obtain her Doctorate in Occupational Therapy. Her project focuses on the effectiveness of self-awareness and internet safety for improving friendship skills in adults with intellectual disabilities. 25 people supported at BPSW have been participating in the project.

They initially completed friendship surveys to determine how they perceive their current friendships and whether there are any barriers to meeting friends. Next, they began meeting in small groups with Madalyn weekly where they engaged in different social stories to help discuss friendships and skills needed to engage in the community safely. They learned and practiced skills to ensure safety and privacy in navigating the internet and social media. And then everyone enjoyed an art activity where the focus was improving self-perception and increasing autonomy.

This project has been a really positive experience for everyone involved. Many of them start each morning by asking when they are meeting with Madalyn that day. The project has opened discussions on friendships and using social media safely outside of the actual sessions.

There has also been more of an effort amongst people participating in the sessions to be more inclusive to their peers-inviting people to join them at lunch if they notice someone sitting alone, for example. Parents have been really enthusiastic about their children being a part of this experience as they realize the importance of building self-awareness and confidence when in the community and in using the internet.

When asked for feedback about being a part of the project, Forrest said that he loves meeting with his friends and Madalyn and that he doesn't want it to end. He said he learned about being more careful when in the community. Casey said she really enjoyed the art project and that she feels like she has better internet safety skills. She feels like everyone should be aware that if you get a friend request from Justin Bieber, you should not accept it, because it's not really Justin Bieber.

Caroline loved making pictures of her favorite things, playing the different card games with her peers, and said she will make sure she is a good friend to others.



Madalyn finishes her time with us on April 17th and will soon graduate from Cedar Crest College with her doctorate in Occupational Therapy. We will all miss her when she's gone but have found her time with us to be invaluable. We look forward to using and building on the tools that she has given us, so that we can enhance the knowledge, confidence and experiences of the people we support at BPSW.

A Message from the Executive Director

BARC Developmental Services has entered its 74th year of providing supports and service to children and adults with intellectual disabilities and autism. 2024 was a busy year for the agency as we continued our commitment to quality care. Some examples of agency growth include:

- Two new ranch style homes were purchased to provide long-term housing stability for four individuals
- · Increase in the number of individuals supported in community employment
- 5.5% increase in children supported in Early Intervention
- We increased our workforce by over 11% and the vacancy rate in Direct Support Professionals (DSPs) decreased by 10%. Our dedicated staff continue to provide the best possible supports.

A main focus of the agency in 2024 was advocating with state and local legislators for increased funding for agencies across the state who support individuals with ID/A. A highlight of the year occurred last April when PA Governor Josh Shapiro, Human Services Secretary Dr. Valerie Arkoosh and Deputy Secretary of Office of Developmental Programs (ODP) Kristin Ahrens visited BARC Developmental Services.

The main purpose of the visit was to promote the Governor's 2024-25 state budget proposal, which included significant additional funding for the ID/A system to increase provider rates and decrease the waiting list. We are proud to have been a part of this historical investment in our system!

We continue to be proud of the impact we have in our communities. The agency vision remains true today: BARC Developmental Services will assist and support individuals with intellectual disabilities and autism to reach their fullest potential, lead happy lives and contribute to their community. Thank you to all our stakeholders and constituents for your support, it is very much appreciated!
